# RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE EXPANSIAN OF THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE NUECES COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 4

WHEREAS the Nueces County Water Control and Improvement District No. 4 (the "District") is a water control and improvement district and political subdivision of the State of Texas, organized and existing pursuant to Article XVI, Section 59 of the Texas Constitution; and,

WHEREAS, the District has the powers and duties granted to it by the general laws of the State of Texas, including Chapters 49 and 51 of the Texas Water Code applicable to water control and improvement districts; and,

WHEREAS, the District desires to expand its powers to include those powers and duties provided by the general laws of the State of Texas, including Chapter 36 of the Texas Water Code applicable to groundwater conservation districts;

WHEREAS, Senator Juan Hinojosa has sponsored and filed Senate Bill No. 2475 relating to the powers and duties of the Nueces County Water Control and Improvement District No. 4; and,

WHEREAS, the District desires to express its support of Senate Bill 2475 and the expansion of the powers and duties of the District to include those powers and duties provided by the general laws of the State of Texas, including Chapter 36 of the Texas Water Code applicable to groundwater conservation districts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Nueces County Water Control and Improvement District No. 4, acting by and through its duly elected Board of Directors hereby expresses its support of Senate Bill 2475 and the expansion of the powers and duties of the District to include those powers and duties provided by the general laws of the State of Texas, including Chapter 36 of the Texas Water Code applicable to groundwater conservation district and in particular the support of the amendment of Chapter 75, Acts of the 57th Legislature, Regular Session, 1961, to add Section 5A to read as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 75, Acts of the 57th Legislature, Regular Session, 1961, is amended by adding Section 5A to read as follows:

Sec. 5A. (a) The District has the powers and duties provided by the general laws of this state, including Chapters 49 and 51, Water Code, applicable to a water control and improvement district and the powers and duties provided by the general laws of this state, including Chapter 36, Water Code, applicable to a groundwater conservation district.

### AN ACT

relating to the powers and duties of the Nueces County Water Control and Improvement District No. 4; providing powers of eminent domain.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 75, Acts of the 57th Legislature, Regular Session, 1961, is amended by adding Section 5A to read as follows:

- Sec. 5A. (a) The District has the powers and duties provided by the general laws of this state, including Chapters 49 and 51, Water Code, applicable to a water control and improvement district and the powers and duties provided by the general laws of this state, including Chapter 36, Water Code, applicable to a groundwater conservation district.

Dear Board Members,

The Newport Dunes has requested that the District reconsider its Effluent Use Agreement. This agreement was signed in August of 2003 when the effluent totals were at their peak. Since this time, improvements to the sewer collection system, building codes, and the City's drainage system have all contributed to a reduction in total sewer treated by the treatment plant, thus reducing effluent availability. The District fulfills the requirement of the 485,000 gallons per day to satisfy the Birding Facility before any effluent is allowed to be pumped to the golf course.

There are approximately 170 days of the year that we are unable to fulfill the amount of effluent that would be equivalent to the \$184.00 daily minimum. As requested in the letter from Newport Dunes, they are asking the District to remove the daily minimum and reduce the rate charged for effluent. At this time, I am recommending to the Board that we suspend the minimum daily rate of \$184.00 per day until such time as the District Staff decides to re-evaluate the contract and determines that it is in the best interest of the District to reinstate the terms and conditions set forth in the original Effluent Use Agreement. This should create an annual savings of around \$17,000.00 and should be a fair amendment for the Effluent Use Agreement.

I am attaching a brief summary of expenses, revenue and contract notes for your reading and will be prepared to discuss this at the meeting.

Dear Mark:

This letter is concerning our current contractual agreement with Nueces County Water District on the purchase of Effluent water for irrigation to the golf course.

While our revenues show only a 3 % shortfall, the current economic market as it relates to real estate sales is not supporting the financial shortfalls the golf course incurs each month. This has forced the ownership to initiate both a reduction in work force and related activities in an attempt to minimize the clubs financial deficits.

In reviewing our contractual agreement with the Water District (which was made prior to construction and completion of the golf course), we are paying a flat fee to access the effluent at a rate of \$5,250 per month whether we use the daily allotted gallons or not. We would like to propose the following based on the historical data maintained by both the Water District and Newport Dunes Golf Club over the previous two years.

- Monthly Billing for actual gallons received from the District. This would save the club substantial dollars we currently allocate for water we do not receive from the District.
- A per gallon pricing to be comparable to other entities within both the Coastal Bend and State of Texas. This pricing would be based on research by both the Water District and Newport Dunes Golf Club to find an equitable rate for both entities.

These contractual changes would allow Newport Dunes to both maintain its current workforce and goal of providing an affordable world-class golf course to area residents and enhance the local tourism industry.

Mark I appreciate your consideration of these proposals and look forward to providing any assistance you require concerning these items.

### **UTILITY SERVICES AGREEMENT**

THE STATE OF TEXAS

THIS AGREEMENT, dated the 17<sup>4</sup> day of June, 2009, by and Carl F Badalich, and wife, Sherry L. Badalich, whose residence and principal place of business are located in Corpus Christi, Nueces County, Texas (Hereinafter referred to as "Owner") and NUECES COUNTY WATER CONTROL & IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 4, a water control and improvement district and political subdivision of the State of Texas (hereinafter referred to as the "District");

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Carl F Badalich, and wife, Sherry L. Badalich are the owners of a tract or parcel of land on Mustang Island in the County of Nueces, State of Texas, lying within the boundaries of the Nueces County Water Control & Improvement District No. 4; and,

WHEREAS, Owner is desirous of obtaining water and sewer service for future development and, as such, intends to provide an adequate supply of fresh potable water and sewage service to the owners of these developments; and,

WHEREAS, the District and Owner have met and conferred relating to the providing of utility services to the occupants of the lands to be developed by Owner; and

WHEREAS, the District has passed and adopted policies for the providing of water and sewage service to the owners and occupants of land lying within the District; and,

WHEREAS, the District has agreed to supply an adequate supply of fresh potable water and to provide sewage service to the occupants of the land lying within the District; and,

WHEREAS, the District has agreed to supply an adequate supply of fresh potable water and to provide sewage service to the occupants of the land described as Lots One (1) and Three (3), Block One (1), Sunrise Shores, a subdivision of the City of Corpus Christi, Nueces County, Texas, as shown on a plat recorded in Volume 46, Page 81-82, of the Map Records of Nueces County, Texas (hereinafter referred to as the "Owner Tract"), upon terms and conditions mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto:

NOW, THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the premises, Owner and the District hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The District agrees to furnish, at all times after the date hereof (subject to other provisions hereof), a supply of fresh potable water to the occupants of the Owner Tract, regardless of the ownership of said property, and, at all times after the date hereof to take, receive, transmit and treat sewage from said property, the furnishing of water and the taking, receipt and transmission of sewage being subject to the usual and customary charges and fees (including capital impact fees) paid by the users in the District for such services, and subject to interruptions in said service due to normal maintenance, repair and upkeep of the water and sewer system of the District, or any other cause beyond the control of the District.
- 2. Before the District shall actually begin to deliver water to the Owner Tract, there shall have been installed without cost to the District, transmission and distribution lines of a nature then required under the District's water distribution standards uniformly applicable to subdivisions within the District, sufficient to connect the Owner Tract to the tap point or points provided for herein below, and to provide for water distribution to users in the Owner Tract.

- 3. Before the District shall actually begin to deliver water to the Owner Tract, sewage collection lines of a nature then required under the District's sewage collection and treatment standards uniformly applicable to subdivisions within the District, sufficient to connect the Owner Tract to the District's collection Line and to provide for sewage collection to users in the Owner Tract, shall have been installed without cost to the District.
- 4. The District shall, subject to the reservations set forth in Paragraph 1. above, make available from mains along State Highway 361 a supply of fresh potable water adequate in amount and pressure at all times to serve the contemplated residential and/or commercial development upon the Owner Tract. Service to the Owner Tract shall be made available by tap or taps to a State Highway 361 main at a location (tap point or points) convenient to the Owner Tract and in accordance with good engineering practice, and when good engineering practice requires, provide that the main water distribution system for the Owner Tract will be looped back to the Distribution Main in a manner approved by the District's Engineers, and further provided that the actual cost of the taps shall be borne by the Owner.
- 5. The District may charge for water delivered to users in the Owner Tract, and for the collection, transmission and treatment of sewage from the Owner Tract such regular and customary rates and charges as may be charged by the District to other users within the District, and users within the Owner Tract shall be treated by and subject to the regulations of the District on the same and uniform basis as other users within the District. In the event there is a shortage or decrease in water supply and/or sewer capacity

within the District, then the users within said lands shall be restricted on the same and uniform basis as other users within the District.

- 6. Owner agrees that by making application for water service to the District, which application must be made prior to the commencement of any construction on the property, that it will do the following:
  - a. Provide the Manager of the District with the following:
- (1)A set of current and future construction plans of the proposed improvements, including the location of water distribution and sewage collection lines servicing the property, and a set of "as-built" plans showing the location of said lines certified to by the Engineer/Architect for the Developer.
- (2) A copy of all plats and re-plats of the Owner Tract showing approval by the appropriate municipality or governmental agency.
- (3) Proof of ownership either by deed or, a Title Opinion from an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Texas showing that the property that is the subject matter of this Agreement is in fact owned by the party or parties entering into the same.
- b. File a Petition with the District, requesting that the District annex said land into the District. The District must annex said land into the District before the District is obligated to provide a fresh supply of potable water and before it is required to provide sewage service to the occupants of the land.
- 7. Owner agrees that at such time as the water distribution lines and trunk lines are completed and tested in accordance with standards acceptable to the District, it will dedicate the said lines, with exclusive easements, to the District, and provide a warranty

to the District for a period of one (1) year drawn in accordance with standards adopted by the District.

- 8. Owner agrees to pay within ten (10) days after billing, all reasonable and necessary fees and expenses incurred by the District resulting directly from the project contemplated on the Owner Tract, including, but not limited to, fees and expenses incurred for engineering and legal work by the District relating to said project.
- 9. In the event Owner develops the property which is the subject matter of this Agreement in two or more phases, or subdivides said property and sells individual lots, then, in that event, it is agreed by Owner, its successors and assigns, that the provisions of this Agreement shall be applicable to each such phase or lot and a reference to this Agreement shall be made in each conveyance.
- 10. Owner agrees that all items required to be furnished by Owner to the District under the provisions of this Agreement will be delivered to the District as soon as the items are available, but in no event later than thirty (30) days following the completion of the improvements contemplated on the Owner Tract. Failure to so provide the items required by this Agreement within the time allotted hereunder, shall be deemed a breach of this Agreement and the District shall not be required to provide further water and/or sewage service to the Owner Tract until Owner has completely fulfilled its obligations hereunder.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR WATER SERVICE FOR EXISTING STRUCTURES LOCATED ON LAND NOT INCLUDED IN THE NUECES COUNTY WATER CONTROL & IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 4

11. In the event any phrase, clause or paragraph in this Agreement is deemed invalid, in is agreed by the parties hereto that the same shall not affect any other phrase, clause or paragraph in this Agreement.

12. This Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns; it being expressly agreed that the District's and Owner's obligations hereunder shall inure to the benefit of the future owner or owners of all or a portion of the Owner Tract. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas and shall be performable in Nueces County, Texas.

This Agreement shall supersede all previous agreements and contracts dealing with the lands described as the Owner Tract.

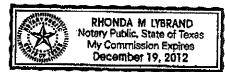
